Edelweiss Trip to Bayern—June 2018

Fifteen GTEV Edelweiss Detroit members took vacations of varying lengths to Germany this summer. We did not travel together the entire time, but we did meet up from May 31-June 3 in the small town of Haldenwang near Kempten in the beautiful Allgäu region of Bavaria to take part in four great days of fun, dance, and Bavarian tradition.

GTEV Edelweiss Detroit belongs to the umbrella organization Gauverband Nordamerika (Gau-NA). Over 70 Trachten- and Schuhplattler clubs throughout the U.S. and Canada are Gau-NA members. Those clubs have about 5000 members.

Every two years Gau-NA holds a festival with dance competition; the winners of that competition are invited to Bavaria the following year to take part in a one-day competition called the “Bayerischer Löwe” with the top dancers from up to 12 different other regional umbrella groups. A different group hosts this every year – and 2018 was Gau-NA’s turn to host. Getting everyone to come to North America was not possible, so fellow Trachtenverein “D’Wagegler” of Haldenwang in the Allgäu offered to help us host it in conjunction with the Allgäuer Gaufest they hosted the same weekend.

Hosting an event on the other side of the ocean requires a great deal of coordination and planning, which started two years ago. Fortunately, Gau-NA’s 1. Gauvorplattler, Rudy Leschke (the lead dance officer), was up to the task. The day of the competition, 41 volunteers took their places to run registration, tabulate scores, lead the three dance circles, work as judges, and coordinate the musicians. Three Edelweiss Detroit members were very involved in this: **Rick Michels**, who is Gau-Musikwart for Gau-NA, coordinated the musicians as well as playing for many of the Gau-NA competitors. **Karin Dean-Kraft**, who is Gau-Pressewart for Gau-NA, led the dance circle that the ladies competed on. **Lauren Kraft** led the dance circle that the youth competed on and then went on to do the announcing for the groups that competed.



All in all, Gau-NA did an impressive job of hosting the event, and our Bavarian friends were quite complimentary of the outcome.

241 dancers competed ranging in age from 7 to over 60; Gau-NA had 27 competitors. 31 groups, 2 from Gau-NA, competed. No wonder the competition takes about 7 hours total! Over 1000 people from all over Bavaria were on hand to watch. Awards were announced late in the day and Gau-NA had a great showing. From Gau-NA, 260 people from 38 different clubs made the trip. participate every two years, this is the biggest turnout Gau-NA has ever had in the 15 years we've taken part.

It wasn't just the competition that took us to Bayern. We also wanted to take part in the Allgäuer Gaufest, a two-day festival that included the 47 clubs in the Allgäu as well as clubs from other parts of Bavaria. On the day that the parade was held, 3000 people dressed in their finest Tracht took part. 110 different marching brass bands, Trachten- and Schützenvereine, horse drawn wagons and carriages, old tractors representing the Allgäu's agricultural tradition, and several Alphorn groups (another Allgäu specialty) made the parade colorful, beautiful, and meaningful. Over 200 from Gau-NA took part with flags from Gau-NA and seven clubs. Many of our Gau-NA clubs also danced an individual Ehrentanz and danced in an impressively large Massenplattler (group Schuhplattler) on the stage, in front of the stage, and in the aisles both at the Friday night Heimatabend and on Gaufest Sunday.

Edelweiss had twelve members and three friends go along from the U.S. We met up with seven of our Bavarian members while there. The brass band from Rottenbuch that played here in Detroit in 2017 was at the Gaufest, so we saw many of our friends. About twenty years ago a group from the Allgäu visited us and played for our Oktoberfest at the Carpathia Hall. After all these years, they made it a point to find us among the 3000 guests at the Gaufest—what a fun reunion! Over the years we have made many friends throughout Gau-NA as well as in Bavaria.

Edelweiss Detroit members are proud to uphold the traditions and ethnic costume of Bavaria as we have done since our founding in 1931. A benefit to membership is the opportunity to have great adventures and so much fun with fellow members who are both friends and family.


